Supporting Your Patients at High Risk of Lung Cancer

Ontario Health recommends using low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) through an organized cancer screening program to screen people at high risk of getting lung cancer.

Your patients may qualify for referral to the Ontario Lung Screening Program (OLSP) if they meet the following inclusion criteria:

- ✓ 55 to 74 years old, and
- ✓ A current or former smoker who has smoked cigarettes daily for at least 20 years* *not necessarily 20 consecutive years

How to Refer Patients at High Risk of Getting Lung Cancer to the OLSP:

- Physicians and nurse practitioners can refer to the OLSP.
- Not all patients referred to the OLSP will qualify for lung cancer screening in the program. Upon referral, patients will undergo a personalized lung cancer risk assessment to determine eligibility.
- Currently, there are four <u>OLSP locations</u> (Toronto, Oshawa, Sudbury and Ottawa). The OLSP will expand to additional hospital sites across the province in the future.

- Refer your patients who smoke tobacco cigarettes and are interested in making a quit attempt to join <u>STOP on the Net</u>, a free online smoking cessation program offered by the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH).
- Eligible participants receive a **free 10-week kit** containing 10 boxes of nicotine patches and 5 boxes of nicotine gum or lozenges, mailed directly to their address.
