REFER patients ages 55 to 74 to the **Ontario Lung Screening Program (OLSP)** if they have smoked cigarettes daily for at least 20 years (not necessarily 20 years in a row). **Note:** not everyone who meets the referral inclusion criteria will be eligible for lung cancer screening in the program.
