Expansion of the Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP) to Include People Ages 40 to 49 in Fall 2024

What will Change in Fall 2024?

- The OBSP will recommend that eligible women, Two-Spirit, trans and non-binary people ages 40 to 49 have a conversation with a healthcare provider regarding the risks and benefits of screening, as well as their values and preferences, to determine if screening is right for them.
- Those who decide to get screened will:
 - Be able to <u>self-refer</u> for a screening mammogram by contacting an OBSP site.
 - <u>Receive the benefits of organized screening</u>, including result and recall correspondence and follow-up.

What is the current screening mammography process for people ages 40-49?

- Currently, people ages 40-49 at average risk of developing breast cancer are **not** eligible for screening through the OBSP.
- People ages 40-49 are encouraged to make a personal decision about screening in consultation with their family doctor or nurse practitioner and <u>can be referred for a</u> <u>screening mammogram outside of the OBSP</u>.

Who is currently eligible for breast screening through the OBSP?

Average Risk:

- Currently, the <u>OBSP</u> recommends that most eligible women, Two Spirit, trans and nonbinary people at average risk of breast cancer have a mammogram every two years between the ages of 50 to 74.
 - Eligible people can self-refer for a screening mammogram by contacting an <u>OBSP</u> <u>site</u>.
 - OBSP participants receive the benefits of organized screening, including result and recall correspondence and follow-up.

High Risk:

- The OBSP recommends that people ages 30 to 69 who meet the <u>High Risk OBSP eligibility</u> <u>criteria</u> get screened every year with both mammography and breast MRI (or screening breast ultrasound if MRI is not medically appropriate).
 - A referral from a physician or nurse practitioner is required.
